## WAA Mission



Our yearlong mission to **Remember, Honor, Teach** is carried out, in part, by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, veterans' cemeteries, and other locations in all 50 states and beyond. Although people may be most familiar with National Wreaths Across America Day, the organization's mission lasts far beyond one day in December.

## "Remember" the fallen.

When a volunteer places a wreath on a servicemember's grave on National Wreaths Across America Day, we encourage them to speak that person's name aloud, thank them for their service and sacrifice, and reflect on their life along with our wreath-laying ceremonies. WAA also holds special memorial ceremonies at all cemeteries throughout the country.

On the tip-lands in Maine, where the tips of balsam fir trees are harvested to become veterans' wreaths, replica dog tags representing thousands of veterans create a living memorial of fallen veterans giving back to other fallen veterans.

# **WAA History Timeline**

- 1992: The first wreaths (5,000) were donated, and a tradition started by Maine wreathmaker Morrill Worcester, owner of Worcester Wreath Co., as a gift of thanks. He and his family quietly continued this tradition for 15 years.
- **2005:** An iconic photo of wreaths in the snow became a viral sensation.
- **2007:** Wreaths Across America formed as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit.
- Since 2008, Congress annually proclaims a Saturday in December as National Wreaths Across America Day.
- **2012:** Millionth wreath placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- 2014: Every headstone at Arlington National Cemetery received a sponsored veteran's wreath for the first time.
- **2016:** 25th year that veterans' wreaths were placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- 2018: Mission advances overseas with the first placement of 9,387 veterans' wreaths at Normandy-American Cemetery in France.
- **2021:** Marked the 30th year veterans' wreaths were placed at Arlington National Cemetery.
- **2022:** 2.7 million wreaths were placed at over 3,700 locations nationwide and abroad.

## **2023** Recap

- Three million sponsored wreaths were placed nationwide.
- More than three million volunteers participated at 4,224 participating locations nationwide. More than a third of the volunteers were children.
- ★ At Arlington National Cemetery, 68 tractor-trailers delivered 259,000 veterans' wreaths, which more than 30,000 volunteers placed.
- ★ 675 loads of wreaths were delivered across the country by over 332 transportation companies.

# **2024 Theme: Live with Purpose**

'Live with Purpose' draws inspiration from the remarkable stories of these volunteers whose impactful work in their communities is a beacon of inspiration for all. "Over the course of the last year, and then especially on the escort to Arlington last December, I listened to people who had gone through great adversity, and they'd taken that adversity and turned it around as a call to action to spend the rest of their lives making sure that every day was meaningful and that they lived with purpose," said executive director Karen Worcester. "For me, living with purpose is a mindset."

# Wreaths Across America Announces New TEACH Partnership Agreement with the Korean War Legacy Foundation

National nonprofit Wreaths Across America proudly announced its new TEACH partnership agreement with the Korean War Legacy Foundation (KWLF) in 2024. Through this new partnership, both organizations will create engaging and relevant content designed to educate and inspire students with a curriculum that encourages character development, civic responsibility, respect, and honor.

# Wreaths Across America Invites Community Throughout the Country to Wave Their Flags on Tuesday, September 10

Wreaths Across America has invited citizens across the country to join in waving their flags on Tuesday, September 10, 2024, between 9-10 am EST in remembrance of those lost on 9/11/01. In addition to local efforts, a national event was hosted LIVE on WAA's <u>official Facebook</u> <u>page</u> and broadcast over <u>Wreaths Across America Radio</u>.

Every Tuesday morning from 9-10 am EST, WAA volunteers raise the American flag from the Freeport Flag Ladies Monument on Route 1 in Jonesboro, Maine. The monument was built by WAA in partnership with its cofounder, Morrill Worcester, in September 2019 in honor of the <u>Freeport Flag Ladies</u>, who retired after 18 years of waving the American Flag in Freeport, Maine, each Tuesday since September 11, 2001.

In 2024, the MEE visited and other notable veterans' events in NC, SC, GA, FL, AL, TN, OH, IA, IL, ME, NY, VA. For the remainder of 2024, the MEE will be traveling to DC, DE, and GA before joining the "Escort to Arlington" in December to help deliver veterans' wreaths as part of National Wreaths Across America Day on Saturday, December 14, 2024.



## The Escort to Arlington

The Wreaths Across America annual "Escort to Arlington" is what many people consider the country's longest veterans' parade. This 12-truck convoy begins at the organization's headquarters in Columbia Falls, Maine, the week before Wreaths Across America Day.

As the convoy travels to Arlington National Cemetery to deliver veterans' wreaths to our nation's interred veterans, it is accompanied by Chevrolet vehicles, the Wreaths Across America Mobile Education Exhibit, local first responders, and supporters as they make their way down the East Coast.
